Fourth Supplement to:

Petition for Waiver and Relief of E-rate Rules  
on Behalf of Victims of Iowa Storms and Floods  
Date posted online at FCC: March 3, 2011

This fourth supplement provides updated information concerning the Petition for Waiver and Relief of E-rate Rules filed on behalf of victims of Iowa 2008 storms and floods. This data was gathered in March 2011, through contact with the individual schools, districts, and public libraries impacted by the storms.

Please note that the information contained in this supplement adds to and/or updates four previous documents: (1). the Petition for Waiver and Relief, filed August 2008, (2). the Supplement to the Petition for Waiver and Relief, filed September, 2008, and (3). the Second Supplement to the Petition for Waiver and Relief, filed March 2009, (4) the Third Supplement to the Petition for Waiver and Relief, filed August 2009. Unless so noted in this supplement, we continue to request relief described in these four previously filed documents.

This supplement provides details about construction status for three facilities where new construction was needed.

- Cedar Rapids Public Library
- Washington Irving Elementary School, Waverly
- Cedar Rapids Educational Services Center

The Cedar Rapids Library remains in temporary quarters. A new property location for the library has been acquired with construction on a new facility to start in fall of 2011. The library director forecasts that the new building will open in May of 2013.

The Waverly-Shell Rock Washington Irving students remain in temporary facilities. The district held a bond referendum on April 7, 2009, to replace Washington Irving Elementary School and that vote was successful. Because the district has an older and outdated facility, the Board decided to combine the old junior high (grades 7 and 8) with the Washington Irving student body (grades 5 and 6) for a new Waverly-Shell Rock Middle School. Construction of the new facility is nearly complete and occupancy is scheduled for August 2011.

The Cedar Rapids Educational Services Center, the hub of the Cedar Rapids Community School District, has been in temporary facilities such the flood of 2011. The Board voted to rebuild on a new location. Construction has started and is scheduled for completion in March 2012.

All previous requests for waiver and relief remain, with the exception of the three facilities described in this supplement. In this supplement, we request the following:

Due to the fact that (a) all three facilities have been in temporary quarters for almost three years and (b) no E-rate compensation was granted for the additional costs of setting up temporary internal networks, we request that the FCC grant a 90% discount level for a period of two years for these facilities. This request is in lieu of 90% discounts for the costs while they were in the temporary facilities.
