On 17 March 2011, the Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) convened a multivendor meeting, which included Alcatel-Lucent, Ericsson, Harris, IP Wireless, LGE, Motorola, and Nokia-Siemens. Representatives from the aforementioned vendors met with Jennifer Manner, Ziad Sleem, Yoon Chang, Behzad Ghaffari, Pat Amodio, Michael Ha, Brian Hurley, Kurian Jacob, Erika Olsen, Henning Schulzrinne, and Jason Kim of the Commission. Alcatel-Lucent was represented at the meeting by Wim Brouwer, Tewfik Doumi, Jeffrey Marks and the undersigned.

In the meeting, the parties discussed public safety network interoperability requirements that would allow for build-out of the 700 MHz Long Term Evolution wireless broadband network. Specifically, Alcatel-Lucent’s presentation focused on the single network v. network of networks approach, the nationwide framework for priority access and quality of service, roaming, and the need for standardized applications for APIs. Alcatel-Lucent’s presentation is set forth in the attached handout.
