APPENDIX

SCOPE OF RELIEF SOUGHT

American Broadband & Telecommunications (“American Broadband”) is seeking forbearance from Section 214(e)(1)(A) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (“Act”) and Sections 54.201(d)(1) and 54.201(i) of the Commission’s rules, which requires eligible telecommunications carriers (“ETC”) to use their own facilities to provide services supported by the Universal Service Fund (“USF”).

American Broadband hereby provides the following information in accordance with Sections 1.54(a) and (e) of the Commission’s rules:

1. American Broadband petitions the Commission to forbear from enforcement of Section 214(e)(1)(A) of the Act, 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(1)(A), and Sections 54.201(d)(1) and 54.201(i) of the Commission’s rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 54.201(d)(1), (i).
2. American Broadband seeks forbearance only on its own behalf.
3. American Broadband seeks forbearance for its provision of CMRS services.
4. American Broadband seeks forbearance with respect to those states in which American Broadband will seek designation as a wireless ETC from the relevant state commissions.

All supporting data which American Broadband intends to rely upon is included in the American Broadband Petition for Forbearance filed with the Commission on February 25, 2011. American Broadband is not relying upon any separate market analysis and, therefore, has not attached a separate appendix with supporting data.
