Dear Ms. Dortch:

On March 29, 2011, Mark A. Stachiw, Executive Vice President, General Counsel and Secretary of MetroPCS Communications, Inc. ("MetroPCS"), along with Carl W. Northrop and Michael Lazarus of Paul, Hastings, Janofsky & Walker LLP ("Paul Hastings") met with Richard Arsenault, John Schauble, Kathy Harris, Michael Connelly and Lindsey Champlin of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau. The oral presentations made during the meeting were consistent with the pleadings and *ex partes* filed on behalf of MetroPCS in the above-referenced proceeding. MetroPCS opined that the existing wireless renewal process is working, and has the benefit of being unburdensome, expedited and predictable. MetroPCS indicated that changes to the process could deter secondary market transactions, discourage the purchase and sale of stations in periods leading up to renewals, and adversely affect financing transactions. MetroPCS referenced the fact that it deploys the spectrum it holds on a timely, and often expedited, basis, and that any additional requirements placed upon licensees for renewal may potentially delay broadband deployment.
