On April 26, 2011 Michael Goggin, and I, on behalf of AT&T Services, Inc., met with David Furth, Patrick Donovan, Thomas Beers, Henning Schulzrinne, David Siehl, Aaron Garza, and (via telephone) Erika Olsen from the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau and Stan Scheiner from the Office of Inspector General. During the meeting, AT&T answered questions from the FCC about AT&T's response to the Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking on Wireless E911 Location Accuracy Requirements, the Notice of Inquiry for the E911 Requirements for IP-Enabled Service Providers and Notice of Inquiry for the Framework for Next Generation-911 Deployment.

In particular, AT&T discussed the E911 requirements for IP enabled service providers, Next Generation-911 non-voice and multimedia services communications, liability protection for NG-911, and wireless location accuracy as outlined in the document attached to this letter, which was presented at the meeting.
