Dear Ms. Dortch:

On April 28, 2011, Maureen O'Connell, Senior Vice President, Government Relations, News Corporation; Ron Wheeler, Senior Vice President, Content Protection, Fox Group; and Rick Lane, Senior Vice President, Government Relations, News Corporation, met separately with (i) William Lake, Mary Beth Murphy, Michelle Carey, Nancy Murphy, Alison Neplokh, Steven Broeckaert, and Lyle Elder; (ii) Jennifer Tatel of Commissioner Baker's office; and (iii) Joshua Cinelli of Commissioner Copps' office to discuss matters related to the above-referenced proceedings.

During the meetings, Ms. O'Connell, Mr. Wheeler, and Mr. Lane described News Corporation's and Fox's concerns about the impact that the various "all-vid" proposals being considered by the FCC would have on the critical need to protect audio-visual content against theft and unlawful distribution. Specifically, they discussed that even though the FCC may be reformulating its proposal in this proceeding, there are still lots of unsettled questions, and risks remain regarding the disaggregation of content and the lack of effective mechanisms that maintain privacy in a way that adequately protects content owner interests.

In addition, they stressed that there is no need for a regulatory route, as programmers are striking a wide range of deals to enable distribution of content on a

variety of platforms, thus meeting consumer demand to get content anywhere, anytime, and on any device.
