On May 5, 2011, Ross Lieberman, ACA, and the undersigned, Thomas Cohen of Kelley Drye & Warren LLP, met with Zac Katz, Legal Advisor for Wireline Communications, International and Internet Issues to Chairman Genachowski, Patrick Halley, Wireline Competition Bureau, Michael Steffen, Office of General Counsel, and Tammy Sun, Office of Media Relations to discuss the above-mentioned dockets. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the Commission’s proposed reform of the high-cost fund and the creation of the Connect America Fund (“CAF”). More specifically, Messrs. Lieberman and Cohen discussed the importance of the proceeding, the benefits of reform, ACA’s amendments to the Commission’s proposals, and the Commission’s process to reach a decision in the near future. The points raised by ACA were consistent with its comments filed on April 18, 2011. ACA plans to elaborate further when it files reply comments in the above-reference dockets on May 23, 2011.
