RE: Comment on AT&T Acquisition of T-Mobile Docket Number 11-65

Dear Mr. Genachowski:

I object to the proposed consent “To Transfer Control of the Licenses and Authorizations Held by T-Mobile USA, Inc. and Its Subsidiaries as stated on Docket Number 11-65.”

I am currently a T-Mobile subscriber and have had this mobile telephone number for over 15 years with T-Mobile or a predecessor company.

I currently use an iPhone to access the T-Mobile network including usage of internet data. It is my understanding that T-Mobile is the only national carrier (besides AT&T) with a data plan where I can use my iPhone because it is a GSM phone.

I don't want to enter into a contract with AT&T to provide wireless service for my iPhone. **If this takeover is allowed there will only be one national carrier (monopoly?) that I could choose to purchase a data plan for my GSM iPhone which would be AT&T.**

I believe that to approve this merger would result in a monopoly of national data plans for my iPhone which runs a GSM network. I would also ask you to forward this comment to the Department of Justice/Antitrust Division for their evaluation on this specific issue.

I would respectfully ask you not to approve this merger if this would create a monopoly by creating a single national carrier in the United States that provides data plans for a GSM phone such as the iPhone.
