On September 29, 2003, in the above-referenced proceeding, AT&T Communications of Virginia LLC, a wholly-owned subsidiary of AT&T Corp., filed an Application for Review of the Wireline Competition Bureau's August 29, 2003 Memorandum and Opinion and Order.¹ On November 18, 2005, a subsidiary of SBC Communications Inc. merged with AT&T Corp. and in connection with the merger changed the name of the company from "SBC Communications Inc." to "AT&T Inc."²

In view of the course of events since Commission review was requested, AT&T Communications of Virginia LLC withdraws its Application for Review.
