I would urge the Commission to reconsider this application. The commercial money has, and will continue to, always have a place in the consideration of license applications. However, I believe that the interference with high precision GPS by the LightSquared transmissions would be an intrusion into an existing commercial and military band that has successfully operated for many years. I believe that LightSquared knew of this interference and carefully crafted the battlefield to get a license. If they did not know then they positively failed in frequency spectrum testing of the product. Either way, it is LightSquared place as the applicant to positively eliminate the interference. It should be the position of the Commission that existing users should have to replace, at some considerable expense, existing equipment that, by the way, is fully compliant to FCC regulations.

For the record, I am not a high precision GPS user, just an interested GPS user.
