Re: *In re Herring Broadcasting, Inc. d/b/a WealthTV v. Time Warner Cable Inc., (File No. CSR-7709-P), Bright House Networks, LLC (File No. CSR-7822-P), Cox Communications, Inc. (File No. CSR-7829-P), and Comcast Corporation (File No. CSR-7907-P), MB Docket No. 08-214*

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Attached is the Opposition of Time Warner Cable Inc., Bright House Networks, LLC, Cox Communications, Inc., and Comcast Corporation (collectively, "Defendants") to the Petition for Reconsideration ("Petition") filed on July 13 by Herring Broadcasting, Inc. d/b/a WealthTV ("WealthTV").¹ As Defendants were finalizing their Opposition late on July 26, for submission by the required date of July 27, counsel for WealthTV informed counsel for Time Warner Cable and Comcast – and earlier today informed counsel for Cox Communications and Bright House Networks – that WealthTV now wishes to withdraw the portions of its Petition which allege that the Commission's unanimous order was tainted by the involvement or post-Commission employment of former Commission officials. This afternoon, WealthTV submitted a "Statement for the Record" stating that WealthTV will "withdraw[] and retract[]" its allegations regarding "the role of certain former Commission employees," and anticipates filing an "amended Petition for Reconsideration" no later than the close of business on July 28. Curiously, WealthTV now says that it will "amend *and supplement*" its Petition.

Defendants welcome the anticipated withdrawal and retraction but would object to any supplementation.² Given that WealthTV has not yet withdrawn its allegations of misconduct,



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
and Defendants cannot leave those allegations unanswered on the record. Defendants are filing their Opposition to the Petition as it stands, reserving the right to respond to any "amended petition" that does anything other than delete Section II.B of the Petition and all related statements and exhibits. If portions of WealthTV's Petition are struck, as they should be, the Commission can disregard the corresponding portion of Defendants' Opposition as well.





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
