On August 3, 2011, Christopher Guttman-McCabe, Vice President, Regulatory Affairs, and Brian Josef, Assistant Vice President, Regulatory Affairs, CTIA – The Wireless Association® (“CTIA”), met with Sherrese Smith, Senior Counsel and Legal Advisor, Amy Levine, Special Counsel and Legal Advisor, and Jessica Almond, Special Counsel, all in the Office of Chairman Genachowski.

At the request of the Chairman’s Staff, CTIA hereby respectfully files the attached chart highlighting tools offered by several CTIA members to enable subscribers to check data, voice minutes and messaging usage. During the August 3rd meeting, Staff also asked whether dialing shortcuts, text message alerts, and applications count against subscribers’ plan allotments. CTIA surveyed several of its members and respondents indicated that subscribers are not charged for dialing shortcuts or text message alerts. Policies varied among carriers regarding whether accessing a usage application or a mobile web site from a device is a data event that generates fractional data usage.
