RE: WT Docket No. 11-65, Confidentiality of NRUF/LNP Data

Dear Ms. Gillett and Mr. Kaplan:

The Minnesota Attorney General's Office ("OAG") seeks to review Numbering Resource Utilization and Forecast Reports ("NRUF") data related to WT Docket No. 11-65. This letter sets forth the confidentiality provisions this Office will provide the NRUF data pursuant to Minnesota law.

The OAG will keep all NRUF data, and any materials containing such data, only for legitimate law enforcement purposes and will keep such data confidential pursuant to the provisions of the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act ("the Act"), Minnesota Statutes chapter 13 (2010). The OAG will not disclose such data unless the disclosure is required by law or reasonably required to further the legitimate law enforcement purposes. Under Minn. Stat. § 13.03, subd. 1 (2010), government data is presumed to be public, unless classified by another law, including federal law, as nonpublic or confidential. Thus, any information provided that is classified as confidential under federal law would also be treated as confidential by the OAG. Minn. Stat. § 1303, subd. 1.

Information provided to this Office that is not subject to federal confidentiality provisions would still be treated as nonpublic investigate data pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 13.39, subd. 2 (2010) while the investigation is active. When the investigation becomes inactive, the information would be classified as public unless it falls under an exception to the Act. For example, the Act classifies "trade secret information" as nonpublic data with respect to data not on individuals, and as private data with respect to data on individuals. Minn. Stat. § 13.37, subd. 2 (2010).

To the extent a request is made for the NRUF data pursuant to the Act, the OAG will assert any provision of the Act that it believes prevents the OAG from disclosing such data. In addition, the OAG will use its best efforts to provide concerned parties with the notice of such request prior to release of the data.


