I firmly believe the Federal Communications Commission needs to continue working with LightSquared and the GPS industry to design a solution that allows both GPS and 4G-LTE services to coexist.

The Commission's approval will allow badly needed wireless capacity to enter into the market as soon as possible, which will increase productivity of businesses and reduce prices for consumers, not to mention create much needed jobs. LightSquared should be permitted to deploy its 4G-LTE network in its L-Band spectrum so that this valuable spectrum space is not squandered.

Additionally, LightSquared will provide much needed benefits to rural America. The Rural Cellular Association (RCA) has strongly supported LightSquared's network and wholesale-only plan since it will provide rural America with an option for affordable access to a nationwide, robust 4G-LTE network. The RCA has even noted that LightSquared's network is quite possibly the only compatible way for rural Americans to gain affordable access to wireless high speed data services.


LightSquared's low rates will also expand wireless access to other customer bases previously priced out of the expensive technology, allowing more Americans to enjoy the benefits offered by
