On behalf of the Petitioners, we hereby notify the Commission that the Petition for Reconsideration of the Wireline Competition Bureau's January 21, 2011 Letter to the Universal Service Administrative Company (filed February 22, 2011) and Request for Stay of the Wireline Competition Bureau's January 21, 2011 Letter to the Universal Service Administrative Company (filed February 22, 2011) in the above-referenced dockets are now moot. In n. 2 of the Letter of Sharon Gillett, Chief, Wireline Competition Bureau, to D. Scott Barash, Acting Chief Executive Officer, Universal Service Administrative Company, the Bureau stated, "This letter and accompany process replaces the guidance letter previously sent to USAC on January 21, 2011." Inasmuch as the January 21, 2011 letter is no longer legally effective, there remains no reason for the Commission to act on the petition for reconsideration and request for stay of that letter. Accordingly, they may now be dismissed as moot. All signatories to the Petition and Request for Stay consent to the filing of this letter.
