Dear Ms. Dortch:

On September 19, 2011, Christin McMeley, Vice President - Government Affairs and Chief Privacy Officer of Charter Communications, Inc., Patrick Webre, Senior Director and Senior Counsel - Government Affairs for Charter, Al Mottur of Brownstein Hyatt Farber Schreck, LLP, and the undersigned met with Commission staff regarding the above-referenced proceedings. Attending the meeting were: Zac Katz of the Chairman's Office, Paul De Sa of the Office of Strategic Planning and Policy Analysis, Rebekah Goodheart of the Wireline Competition Bureau, and Michael Steffen of the Office of General Counsel. On September 20, 2011, the same group of Charter representatives met with Margaret McCarthy of Commissioner Copps's Office.

In both meetings, Charter reiterated the views expressed in its comments – that the Commission's reform of intercarrier compensation should subject VoIP and circuit-switched traffic to the same rates during any transition. *See* Comments of Charter Communications Inc. to the Commission's Further Inquiry at 2-6 (filed Aug. 24, 2011); Reply Comments of Charter Communications Inc. to the Commission's Further Inquiry at 1-6 (filed Sept. 6, 2011). Charter explained that it is supportive of moving to a unified rate regime, and it urged the Commission to adopt the modified transition plan proposed in Charter's comments. *See* Charter Further Inquiry Comments at 3; Charter Further Inquiry Reply Comments at 6.
