ORDER

By the Chief, Wireline Competition Bureau:

1. In this Order, the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) extends the current temporary assignment¹ of three toll free numbers to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) until November 14, 2011. The Bureau's current assignment of the three toll free numbers expires on September 12, 2011.²

2. The Commission's Order assigning these three toll free numbers from the Kristin Brooks Hope Center (KBHC) to SAMHSA³ was remanded to the Commission by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D. C. Circuit on December 3, 2010.⁴ The Bureau sought comment on issues raised in the *D.C. Court*

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to sections 1, 4(i) and 251(e) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 151, 154(i), and 251(e), sections 1.3 and 52.111 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.3 and 52.111, and pursuant to authority delegated under sections 0.91 and 0.291 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91 and 0.291,¹¹ the current extension of the assignment of toll free numbers 1-800-784-2433 (1-800-SUICIDE), 1-877-784-2432 (1-877-SUICIDA), and 1-888-784-2433 (1-888-SUICIDE) to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration IS EXTENDED to November 14, 2011.
