Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of Sorenson Communications, Inc. (“Sorenson”), I am writing to inform the Commission of an overstatement in the above-referenced application. The application states that Ms. Nataly Malka, “has worked with some of the leading businesses that provide services to the Deaf community,” and that, “[o]ne of those businesses was Sorenson Communications, Inc., where she focused on government relations between Sorenson and the Israeli Government.”¹

Ms. Malka has never “worked with” Sorenson Communications. At one time, Ms. Malka discussed with Sorenson a proposal to approach the Israeli government and to offer to provide Video Relay Service (“VRS”) in Israel. On August 20, 2007, Ms. Malka traveled to Sorenson’s headquarters to provide additional information to Sorenson about her proposal. Sorenson reimbursed Ms. Malka for her airfare to travel to that meeting; the reimbursement totaled \$232.60. Following the meeting, Sorenson declined to hire Ms. Malka as an employee, consultant, or contractor. Sorenson has not made any other reimbursements or payments to Ms. Malka either before that time or since then.
