You were advised by letter dated September 9, 2011, of the death of Mr. Pendleton C. Waugh, a party to the above-referenced proceeding. The impact of Mr. Waugh's death on his pending appeal was to be addressed at a later time and a request was made that Mr. Waugh's pending appeal be held in abeyance.


On September 19, 2011, the Enforcement Bureau filed a pleading with the Commission stating that it did not object to the Commission placing the matter of Mr. Waugh's appeal in abeyance, but suggested that a time limit, perhaps 60 to 90 days, would be appropriate. The Bureau also urged the Commission to require Mr. Waugh's counsel to file written status reports within 30 days of any such order for the purpose of keeping the Commission and the other parties fully informed.

The probate process in Arizona can take at least 150 days from the date probate was filed, which was around September 7, 2011. A notice to creditors is sent out within 30 days. Creditors then have 120 days to make any claims. Consequently, a more realistic timetable would be 180 days.
