Dear Ms. Dortch:

On October 12, 2011, officials from Charter Communications, Inc. and the undersigned met with Commissioner Clyburn and her Legal Advisor Angela Kronenberg. The Charter officials present were Bob Quicksilver, Executive Vice President and Chief Administrative Officer, Christin McMeley, Vice President - Government Affairs and Chief Privacy Officer, Mark Brown, Senior Director and Senior Counsel, and Patrick Webre, Senior Director and Senior Counsel - Government Affairs. During the course of the meeting, Charter touched briefly on matters at issue in the above-referenced proceeding. Specifically, Charter reiterated the argument made in its comments that retransmission consent fees are too high and increasing rapidly – to the detriment of consumers. *See* Comments of Charter Communications, Inc., *In the Matter of Amendment of the Commission's Rules Governing Retransmission Consent*, MB Docket No. 10-71, at 2-7 (filed May 27, 2011).
