Dear Ms. Dortch:

This is to advise you, in accordance with Section 1.1206 of the FCC's rules, that on October 19, 2011, George L. Mahoney, Vice President – Growth and Performance of Media General, Inc. ("Media General"); Andrew C. Carington, Vice President, General Counsel and Secretary of Media General; and I met with Commissioner Robert M. McDowell to discuss Media General's concerns regarding the FCC's regulation of media ownership and spectrum.


In the meeting, Mr. Carington first introduced himself as Media General's new general counsel and provided a little background on his ten years of experience as associate general counsel with the company. Messrs. Mahoney and Carington discussed Media General's recent reorganization from a company with its business divisions structured according to content delivery platform to one based on regional markets, and he reviewed the benefits that have flowed from the reorganization. Those benefits have included an even greater ability to focus on local information needs of communities and an enhanced ability of its journalists in each market to work together on investigative pieces.

Mr. Mahoney also discussed the company's interest in seeing that any spectrum modifications that the FCC may consider in the future do not interfere with its ability to continue to deliver high quality local programming on a traditional, over-the-air basis and via Mobile Digital Television. He noted that he believes that the FCC's interest in fostering broadband deployment and allowing improvements in television broadcasting, such as Mobile DTV, are complementary.
