I am writing to voice my support for the combination of AT&T and T-Mobile USA.

I strongly feel that such a combination will stimulate Maine's much-needed economic recovery, the equivalent of laying in an electronic "infrastructure." It will result in the companies building out a state-of-the-art mobile broadband network that provides the ability to deliver key healthcare, education and other social services.

Small businesses and other organizations would be able to use the kind of wireless services that today are mostly the exclusive domain of large businesses. A world-class broadband network would allow small Maine businesses to expand and compete more effectively in domestic and global markets.


An advanced mobile wireless network would also provide better access to high-quality distance learning and health programs. These services are especially crucial in Dixmont, Hampden and Newburgh – small towns I represent that lack access to specialized educational or medical programs. For example, wireless remote monitoring can automatically transfer patient data to medical personnel at another location in real time, improving patient care and lowering medical costs.
