Dear Ms. Dortch and all, as you know, AT&T and Deutsche Telekom ( T-Mobile) have filed with the FCC to merge. There are a lot of concerns regarding this merger by many parties including the DOJ ( they have filed a separate complaint in Federal Court). There is great concern regarding the numbers of employees and AT&T has tried to trick the FCC and others into thinking there will be 100,000 new jobs because of this merger.

AT&T has knowingly and purposely allowed hundreds of thousands of current and former employees to work with, use and be exposed to carbonless copy paper they knew could cause serious adverse health effects including disabilities, birth defects, cancer and death. Warnings that were prepared to give to employees as early as 1991 have not been given to employees. Instead, innocent, unsuspecting and adversely affected employees have been fired, forced to retire, denied retirements and other benefits solely in order to save money for AT&T , investors etc while purposely and knowingly continuing to allow untold numbers of current and former employees to become sick, disabled, develop cancer and die.

I have been doing my best to work with AT&T on wording of real warnings for employees and other actions to help avoid massive losses for AT&T, possibly into the hundreds of millions or more and loss of thousands of current employees.

Since AT&T refuses to prepare such warnings and help avoid such losses, they are causing me to have to file submissions to the public file with the FCC in this case so as to add all the information related to this so the FCC can really evaluate the real facts and know that AT&T, their counsel and representatives have all known about this and it appears all are keeping these known potential financial and employee losses secreted from the FCC and therefore conspiring to commit fraud upon not only employees, investors, customers, Federal agencies and all others.

I am certain that once I am forced to make such filings and submissions with the FCC in this case, the media will make this a huge story and the claims will begin to be filed against AT&T that will cause great losses for them.

Before I make such filings and submissions tomorrow morning, I thought you would want to be aware of this and how this may affect the current case. I would suspect the FCC will not allow this merger to go through unless and until AT&T can assure the FCC this issue has been resolved so such filings will not be necessary.
