

I rely on an open and participatory Internet to engage in political and social campaigns but big broadband providers want to be able to discriminate. I use the Internet in the following ways: Petitioning members of Congress in both the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives to pass the Congressional Reform Act of 2011 to term limit members of Congress, prevent them from voting themselves pay increases at taxpayer's expense without any accountability etc; passing the STOCK Act to prevent Congressional insider trading while fighting to get the Supreme Court ruling in Citizens United v. FEC overturned and AT&T v. Concepcion overturned.
