RE: Facilitating the Deployment of Text-to-911 and Other Next Generation 911 Applications, PS Docket No. 11-153, Framework for Next Generation 911 Deployment, PS Docket No. 10-255; Amending the Definition of Interconnected VoIP Service in Section 9.3 of the Commission's Rules, GN Docket No. 11-117, Wireless E911 Location Accuracy Requirements, PS Docket No. 07-114, E911 Requirements for IP-Enabled Service Providers, WC Docket No. 05-196.

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 16, 2011, the undersigned and Stephen Meer, Intrado Inc.'s, Chief Technology Officer, met with Amy Levine, Senior Counsel and Legal Advisor to Chairman Genachowski, and discussed the following issues related to the above referenced dockets.

Intrado stated that it supports a text to 911 solution that advances the implementation of next generation 911 (NG911), and that a short message service (SMS) solution is a viable way to achieve that result. Intrado explained that the (SMS) network can be easily adapted to be a reliable network for text to 911.

Intrado also commented that, while it does not advocate the ultimate outcome, it encourages the Commission to identify a location standard in WC Docket No. 05-196, *E911 Requirements for IP-Enabled Service Providers*. Intrado suggested the decision in that proceeding will significantly impact deployments and stressed the need for the industry to have guidance as it designs and builds networks for the future.
