Dear Chairman Genachowski and Commissioners:


The Iowa Utilities Board writes this letter in support of the December 1, 2011, state commission letter signed by the Nebraska Public Service Commission, Missouri Public Service Commission, Minnesota Public Utilities Commission, Montana Public Service Commission, South Dakota Public Service Commission, Michigan Public Service Commission, and Wyoming Public Service Commission regarding the problem of failed call completions in rural areas. While the Board has not formally investigated this matter, it is the Board's understanding that this is primarily an interstate problem associated with the use of least-cost routing for interexchange traffic. This letter is addressed only to the interstate jurisdiction and your jurisdiction; at this time the Board has no position regarding any possible intrastate call completion problems.

With that understanding, the Board supports the December 1, 2011, state commission letter and its request for a declaratory order that reaffirms two principles under federal law. First, carriers are responsible for the completion of interstate calls that are originated by their customers. Second, if an originating carrier is found not to be performing its terminating responsibility, the FCC should take prompt and effective enforcement action, including significant levels of forfeitures, as a means to correct the epidemic call completion problem confronting rural areas of the country.

We appreciate the opportunity to address this issue.
