
Dear Ms. Dortch:

On December 20, 2011, representatives of NextNav, LLC (formally Commlabs, LLC) (“NexNav”) met with representative of the Commission’s Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau (“Bureau”) and the Office of Engineering and Technology (“OET”). Participating in the meeting on behalf of the Bureau were David Furth, Jeffrey Goldthorp, Henning Schulzrinne, Patrick Donovan, David Siehl, Erica Olsen, and Gary Blanks. Participating in the meeting on behalf of OET were Ronald Repasi and James Miller. Participating in the meeting on behalf of NextNav were Gary Parsons, Ganesh Pattabiraman, and the undersigned.

During the meeting, the NextNav representatives expressed many of the same points that were made by Commlabs in its October 3, 2011 comments in the above referenced proceeding. NextNav urged the Commission to maintain its focus on identifying appropriate requirements for achieving indoor location accuracy for E911 services either directly or through its Communications Security, Reliability, and Interoperability Council (“CSRIC”). NextNav also highlighted the technological capabilities that are being developed to achieve indoor elevation (z-axis) location capabilities.
