

Thanks FCC for joining the Justice Department in killing the AT&T T-Mobile merger giving Ma Bell a Ma Cell. Such a merger would have resulted in a near wireless duopoly with Twin Bells AT&T Inc., and Verizon Communications possibly becoming Twin Cells by controlling nearly 80% of the wireless market. It would have left the wireless communications market already increasingly dominated by two companies AT&T and Verizon even more concentrated -- only 2 companies would control 80% of the market and leave Sprint competing for crumbs. Whatever spectrum for national carriers is left after the merger would primarily go to Sprint. Smaller regional carriers facing a spectrum crunch would continue to be in dire need of spectrum. More consolidation would threaten Network Neutrality even more. We need Title II reclassification of broadband and competition mandates for both wire-line fixed broadband and mobile broadband.
