Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Thursday, January 19, 2012 the undersigned counsel for Reunion Communications, Inc. ("Reunion Communications") had a telephone conversation with Beau Finley, attorney in the Telecommunications Access Policy Division of the Wireline Competition Bureau to discuss the proposal, contained in the March 4, 2011 Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the above-captioned proceeding, to eliminate reimbursement for Toll Limitation Services ("TLS").

During the call, I reaffirmed Reunion Communications' opposition to the proposed elimination of Lifeline reimbursement for TLS and support for the alternative of establishing non-recurring and monthly recurring TLS reimbursement caps.¹ In addition, I raised concerns with the wholesale toll restriction rates contained in Exhibit C of AT&T's November 7, 2011 ex parte submission.² Specifically, I noted numerous errors in AT&T's submission, including four states for which the applicable non-recurring charge was omitted and one in which it was understated. I indicated that we would be submitting an exhibit prepared by CGM, LLC showing the correct AT&T rates supported by evidence from AT&T tariffs and guidebooks. A

5.2.6 UNIVERSAL LIFELINE TELEPHONE SERVICE

A. APPLICABILITY

Applicable to residence Universal Lifeline Telephone Service (ULTS)

B. TERRITORY

Within the designated service areas where Nevada Bell is designated as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier pursuant to PUCN Universal Service regulations.

C. DESCRIPTION

Universal Lifeline Telephone Service includes:

1. Discounted installation of a primary residence access line.
2. Discounted basic residence dial tone service.
3. Unlimited incoming calls.
4. Flat Rate and Measured Rate services, available, see Rates and Charges section.
5. Call Restriction service as described in Part 8, Section 2 of the Guidebook is available at no charge.
6. The Utility will apply Call Restriction to a ULTS customer's line for non-payment of toll charges. The Utility will not disconnect the customer's local exchange service for non-payment of toll charges, incurred before Call Restriction is imposed.
7. Provision of an allowance for the applicable FCC End User Common Line charge (EUCL).

D. REGULATIONS

1. Qualification

An applicant must meet all of the following criteria in order to qualify for ULTS: (C)

- a. The applicant's total household gross income does not exceed 175% of the current federally established poverty levels set forth for the number of persons in applicant's household. (C)
- b. The applicant must certify that he/she is not a dependent for federal income tax purposes on another person's federal income tax return.

12. TOLL RESTRICTION

12.1 Regulations

- A. Toll Restriction is a central office service that allows only seven-digit dialed calling and denies access to operator services and directory assistance. Restricted calls are directed to a central office announcement.
- B. Toll Restriction is activated when a dialed number is preceded by a one or a zero or made to directory assistance. However, calls to Inward WATS services are not restricted, and where facilities permit, one plus calls to Company business offices and repair services are not restricted.
- C. All calls to operator services and directory assistance services are disallowed for both residence and business customers.
- D. Toll Restriction is provided in conjunction with one party flat rate business and residence Local Exchange Service.
- E. The minimum contract period for this feature is one month.
- F. Toll Restriction is available only in ESS and digital central offices.
- G. The customer indemnifies and saves harmless the Company from any and all claims, losses and damages caused by this restriction of the customer's long distance calling. See "Rules and Regulations Applying to All Customers' Contracts" section of this Tariff.
