A large part of our success and ability to do this with a very small department relies heavily on our GPS capabilities. Projects which used to take three people to survey now only take one. This allows just four technicians the ability to inspect every project we have going on instead of putting all of our efforts towards one project. This in turn lets the traveling public enjoy the high quality roads that are being produced along with the satisfaction of knowing that they are receiving the best possible product for their tax dollars.

I hope the FCC will seriously consider the impacts to the entire nation if LightSquared's request is approved. The quality of our roads will begin to suffer and that will effect us all for the worst. I thank you for taking the time to read my letter.
