MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

The Tennis Channel, Inc. (“Tennis Channel”) respectfully requests an extension of time — from February 1, 2012 to February 6, 2012 — for the filing of responses to the Conditional Petition for Stay filed by Comcast Cable Communications, LLC (“Comcast”) in this proceeding on January 25, 2012. Responses on the current schedule are due five business days from the filing of the Conditional Petition, which is not sufficient time given the length of the pleading and its level of detail. In addition, the three-business-day extension would permit Tennis Channel to file its opposition on the same day on which it is due to file its oppositions to Comcast’s Application for Review and Comcast’s Exceptions to the Administrative Law Judge’s Initial Decision in this matter; in several respects, Comcast’s three pleadings make overlapping or similar arguments which are most efficiently addressed at one time.

Tennis Channel's counsel has orally notified counsel for the other parties and the Commission's staff of this filing, and Tennis Channel is authorized to state that Comcast and the Enforcement Bureau do not object to its grant.
