

I was unable to stay connected (I heard silence) after calling the Albuquerque Police Department from the Residence Inn at 2301 International Ave Se: Albuquerque, NM 87106 (505) 242 2844 not much more than an hour ago and did not get an answer when calling the Department of Home Land Security (202)-xxx-xxxx that I got from the desk top computer at Cellular Toys near the St. Louis International Airport (the call was made from the entrance way into the Residence Inn shortly before the purchase of a soda (the purchase took place at 1:23 a.m. (Jan 24) according to the receipt that I have now. (I had tried to call about the heat of the heating and air conditioning unit that had push button controls apparently turning on by itself. The man that was working at the front desk that night did not sound as though he thought that the heating unit could turn on by itself and I was concerned that somebody may have repelled from the rooftop and turned the heating and air conditioning unit on through the window of room 310 (which was open and did not come with a screen). "Mary", an Indian or Hispanic woman said that I could not stay in their lobby to make phone calls and that the internet was for guests only. After the purchase of soda she told me that sleep Inn had a room for me. After going back to the room (310) and falling asleep and waking back up I noticed that both of the sheets were on top of me rather than one of the sheets being below me and when I went down to the lobby that had the same hispanic man working (not taller than 5'3") and with dark hair I noticed something peculiar about the hair on my legs. My shins looked as if they had a Mo-Hawk with an abundance of hair on the front of the shins (making a long oval shape). Today I called the Albuquerque Police Department and talked to call taker number (#4344) from room 310 about the power supply that I had just noticed was missing from my back pack. The call taker said that I had two options and one was to make a report online and the other option was to make a call tomorrow to the telephone reporting unit. When I went down stairs to pass through the lobby next to the front office "McKenzy" (the name of the woman according to the conversation that I had with the not so tall hispanic man at the front desk the same night that I tried to call homeland security from the Residence Inn) was at the front desk talking to a man that was sitting at the computer (IBM) at a desk in the lobby. He moved away from the computer and started talking

to the woman at the counter. That is when I walked across the street and tried to call from the lobby of the Residence Inn but received silence on my cell phone. One last comment is on the address that is given for a Big Lots in many yellow page directories in this town including one at 13317 Central Ave. N.E. and according to the manager at a J.B.s near Aztek on 4th Street (the address on the diagonal window of the nearby Walgreens was 6604). The address of the Big Lots according to the manager of J.B.s after he looked in the yellow pages (two days ago) was 6601 4th Street but I did not notice a Big Lots their. Also at that J.B.s they had a sign on the north side of the resturaunt showing that restrooms and phones were in the hallway on the north side of the resturaunt but I only saw restrooms. A call to the the FCC from the lhop (the receipt said 2020 Buena Vista) yesterday was terminated after the woman "on the other end of the conversation" (with the same voice as the person that said "1 dash" before I was disconnected on the south side of the Bank of America at Washington and Central (4601?) recently) said Thank You (after saying that I had to call my Homeland Security (after explaining the silence on the phone after the call from the entrance of the Residence Inn).
