Re: Proposed Extension of Part 4 of the Commission's Rules
Regarding Outage Reporting, PS Docket No. 11-82

Dear Ms. Dortch:

This is to inform you that on February 6, 2012, Joe Marx and Anisa Latif of AT&T, Nneka Ezenwa and Mark Montagno of Verizon, and the undersigned representing USTelecom, held a meeting with Louis Peraertz, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Clyburn, in connection with the proceeding identified above. Consistent with our prior advocacy in this proceeding, we urged that the Commission ensure that any reporting requirements that might be adopted are closely aligned with the Commission's stated public policy goal of ensuring that consumers have access to emergency services. In order to accomplish this goal, the Commission should limit any reporting obligations to outages affecting a company's own 911 facility or involving a complete loss of its interconnected VoIP service that has an actual impact on customers' ability to reach emergency services. We also explained that proposals concerning reporting by broadband Internet access service providers and Internet backbone service providers were not supported by the record in this proceeding, were outside the Commission's legal authority and would impose major burdens on providers.
