Dear Ms. Dortch:

On February 6, 2012, Ray Paddock, Vice President of Emergency Voice Services, Jason Shugart, Director of Technology, Duke Kaczmarczyk, Technology Planner, and myself of Bandwidth.com, Inc. (“Bandwidth.com”); met by teleconference with Patrick Donovan and Henning Schulzrinne of the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau to discuss the Commission’s consideration of Next Generation 911 (“NG9-1-1”) and Text-to-911 issues.

At these meetings, we briefly discussed issues related to Bandwidth.com’s role in supporting text-to-911 traffic routing. Specifically, we spoke about Bandwidth.com’s involvement in text-to-911 trials and demonstrations as well as its recommendations for developing solutions for 9-1-1 texting. Bandwidth.com expressed its support for an interim text-to-911 deployment for the speech and hearing impaired population and discussed how Bandwidth.com could act in the role of a “clearinghouse” to help efficiently receive and route text-to-911 traffic to appropriate PSAPs throughout the country.
