
1. Pending before the Commission is a Motion for Extension of Time, filed by The Tennis Channel, Inc. on January 27, 2012. Tennis Channel requests an extension -- from February 1, 2012 to February 6, 2012 -- for parties filing responses to the Conditional Petition for Stay filed by Comcast Cable Communications, L.L.C. in this proceeding on January 25, 2012. The Motion reflects that Tennis Channel is authorized to state that neither Comcast nor the Enforcement Bureau objects to grant of Tennis Channel's request.

2. The Motion for Extension of Time is supported by good cause and is granted. The additional time is warranted given the level of detail presented in the lengthy Conditional Petition. This extension will permit the parties to file on the same day pleadings that address the similar, overlapping arguments raised by Comcast in the Conditional Petition for Stay, in the Application for Review of the Hearing Designation Order and in the Exceptions to Initial Decision.¹ In these circumstances, the extension will facilitate the Commission's reasoned consideration of the issues in an efficient manner, and, thus, serves the public interest.

3. ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED, That pursuant to the authority set forth in 47 C.F.R. § 0.251(c), the Motion for Extension of Time, filed January 27, 2012, by The Tennis Channel, Inc. IS GRANTED; and that the time for The Tennis Channel and the Enforcement Bureau to file responses to Comcast's Conditional Petition for Stay IS EXTENDED to February 6, 2012.
