**MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME**

Pursuant to section 1.46 of the Commission's rules,<sup>1/</sup> Cablevision Systems Corporation ("Cablevision") respectfully requests, both for itself and for its Bresnan Communications, LLC ("Bresnan") subsidiary, an extension of time to file the broadband data associated with the Federal Communications Commission's Form 477 Local Competition and Broadband Reporting Form, until March 30, 2012.<sup>2/</sup> Cablevision requests a thirty-day extension to file; however, it will make its best efforts to file as soon as practicable.

Cablevision seeks this extension of time in order to file using 2010 census tract data as requested by the Commission. The census tract files that Cablevision received from its third party vendor for use in the filing were based on 2000 census tract codes, instead of the 2010 census tract codes. Subsequently, the third party vendor on which Cablevision relies for census tract data informed Cablevision that it is unable to complete the data matching required to



provide accurate 2010 census tract data by the March 1 filing deadline. The vendor informed Cablevision that it will require at least two weeks to provide accurate 2010 census tract matching for Cablevision's customer base. Once the data files have been updated, Cablevision will need time to organize and upload the data before it can be provided to the Commission.

Cablevision appreciates the importance of timely submission of the information requested by the Commission on Form 477. However, grant of the requested extension will serve the public interest by ensuring that the Commission receives accurate data.
