

least some “3G or better wireless service” in 12,400 of the potential Mobility Fund census blocks listed by the Commission. The list of overlapping census blocks is attached hereto.

Sprint urges the Commission to review its list of census blocks to eliminate those that have “3G or better wireless service” based on the information provided semiannually to NTIA. Eliminating overlapping census blocks will help ensure that the Commission’s policy of providing Mobility Fund Phase I support only “where no provider currently offers [3G or higher] service”² is met. Evidence to support Sprint’s coverage may be found on the coverage maps Sprint posts on its website, www.sprint.com.³ Evidence may also be provided on the NTIA’s National Broadband Map at www.broadbandmap.gov and on state broadband maps.
