The Public Safety Spectrum Trust Operator Advisory Committee is composed of the twenty-one jurisdictions granted waivers of the Commission's rules by FCC Order 10-79 on 12 May 2010, to allow deployment of statewide or local public safety broadband networks in the 700 MHz public safety broadband spectrum (763-768 MHz and 793-798 MHz).

That waiver order and subsequent orders requires the waiver-receiving jurisdictions to provide the capability of interconnecting any networks constructed pursuant to the order.

The PSST-OAC has created an architecture and plan for providing such interconnectivity at such time as such networks become operational. The first networks should become operational in the summer of 2012.

This interconnectivity plan was unanimously approved by the 21 waiver jurisdictions during our face-to-face meeting in Boulder, Colorado, on 8 March 2012.

This interconnectivity plan is hereby submitted for your review and consideration in establishing interoperability requirements and for compliance with the waiver orders.
