Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to procedures established in the *Third Report and Order* in PS Docket No. 07-287 (In the Matter of the Commercial Mobile Alert System) 23 FCC Rcd. 12561 (2008) and Section 10.230 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 10.230, CTC Telecom, Inc. ("CTC" or "the Company"), a subsidiary of Cambridge Telephone Company, P.O. Box 88, 130 North Superior, Cambridge, ID 83610, hereby submits a change of election from that filed on September 3, 2008, wherein the Company initially chose not to transmit emergency messages as part of the Commercial Mobile Alert System (CMAS). CTC now intends to participate in CMAS and states as follows:


1. CTC elects to transmit CMAS emergency alerts.
2. CTC agrees to transmit such alerts in a manner consistent with the technical standards, protocols, procedures, and other technical requirements implemented by the Commission.
3. CTC commits to support the development and deployment of technology for the "C" interface, the CMS provider Gateway, the CMS provider infrastructure, and mobile devices with CMAS functionality and support of the CMS provider selected technology.
