As a resident of the Catoctin area in Virginia, an entrepreneur and an activist, I write to you to encourage the Federal Communications Commission to do all it can to find a solution for LightSquared's national broadband proposal to ensure that all of America is connected to high speed Internet. Currently, residents in Catoctin area have no choice but to stay with whatever wireless provider we have, regardless of services / prices. As more people with school age kids and telecommuters are moving in these rural areas, there is a real need for more competition for better and faster wireless services.

In my view, the FCC can play the role of peace keeper and work to find the solutions that are in the best interests of America. It's my understanding that there have been issues regarding LightSquared's spectrum and potential interference with a handful of GPS devices. I also understand that LightSquared is willing to work hand in hand with the FCC and other stakeholders to come up with a win-win solution for all of us. I hope you'll be an active participant in an effort to find a solution.

The federal government has made national broadband a priority and here we have LightSquared stepping up and already investing about \$4 billion to deploy its integrated satellite-terrestrial network. Fully realized, LightSquared's network will lower prices, increase competition in the wireless marketplace and bring reliable broadband coverage to places like Virginia's Blue Ridge Mountains area.

Connecting America has been a goal of our government for good reason. Being connected brings opportunities, allows tele-commuting, opens doors for talent in rural areas and bridges the divide between rural and more urban locales. It's for these reasons that I strongly urge the FCC to work towards a solution.
