Dear Ms. Dortch:

On April 2, 2012, DIRECTV, LLC (“DIRECTV”) filed a complaint against Tribune Company, Debtor-in-Possession (“Tribune”), alleging that Tribune had failed to negotiate with DIRECTV in good faith in violation of the Communications Act and the Commission’s rules. The resulting impasse caused a disruption in carriage of Tribune’s local broadcast stations and superstation WGN to DIRECTV subscribers.

Last night, DIRECTV and Tribune entered into a new agreement governing carriage of Tribune’s local broadcast stations and WGN. Pursuant to that agreement, DIRECTV was able to restore service to its subscribers.

Accordingly, DIRECTV hereby withdraws its complaint.
