Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Wednesday, April 4, 2012, on behalf of Vonage Holdings Corp. ("Vonage"), the undersigned, of Wiltshire & Grannis LLP, spoke with Lisa Gelb, Marilyn Jones, and Ann Stevens of the Wireline Competition Bureau via telephone to discuss Vonage's pending Petition for Waiver.

Vonage reiterated that it has put into the record examples of commercially available solutions that will allow routing in a manner consistent with routing that exists in the marketplace today. Vonage responded to NARUC's request that the Commission act by rulemaking by reiterating its commitment to responsible use of numbering resources and its agreement with NARUC's position that any waiver should require compliance with the Commission's numbering rules. Finally, Vonage explained that proceeding by waiver would benefit consumers by enabling Vonage to more quickly deliver the benefits of IP interconnection and would benefit the Commission by enabling it to take a measured, step-by-step approach to changes in its numbering policy.
