

Project Mutual Telephone Company hereby provides notice that it intends to cease offering wireline broadband internet access service on a tariffed basis. Effective July 3, 2012 Project Mutual Telephone Company will begin offering wireline broadband internet access service on a Title II, common carriage, permissive detariffed basis pursuant to paragraph 94 of the Federal Communications Commission's Wireline Broadband Order.¹ The geographic areas affected are those Project Mutual Telephone Company exchanges where DSL is technically feasible.

Today, this service is provided to the Project Mutual Telephone Company Internal Internet Service Provider (ISP). This ISP purchases wireline broadband access service for use as a component in their broadband internet service sold to residential and business consumers. End user service provided will not be affected by discontinuance of the tariffed offering by Project Mutual Telephone Company. As stated in the attached customer notice, Project Mutual Telephone Company will continue to offer services to the existing ISP customer under current rates, terms and conditions until the end of their current term or upon replacement with a Broadband Commercial Agreement. Broadband Commercial Agreements will be made available in a nondiscriminatory manner to any provider desiring to purchase wireline broadband access service for use as a component in its broadband internet service sold to consumers.

Effective July 3, 2012, Project Mutual Telephone Company will make its wireline broadband internet access service on a permissive detariffed, common carriage basis through posting of rates, terms and conditions available on our company website (www.pmt.org/terms/regulatory/tariffs/dsl/PMTDSL.pdf) and in printed copy during normal business hours at the Project Mutual Telephone Company business office located at 507 G Street, Rupert, Idaho 83350.
