

The Open Internet is a powerful tool for political activism, communications, commerce and information. Environmental activists are using it every day to send messages of why Keystone XL pipeline should not be permitted to be built (the rhetoric of it creating thousands of jobs is a lie it will create a few temporary jobs but lead to permanent job losses and outsourcing as the tar sands oil is extracted from the U.S. by TransCanada to sell to customers in other countries.
