COUNTERPROPOSAL

Roy E. Henderson ("Henderson"), licensee of Radio Stations KLTR (FM), Brenham, Texas ("KLTR") and KTWL (FM), Hempstead, Texas (KTWL"), hereby submits this Counterproposal to the Notice of Proposed Rule Making, DA 12-552 (released April 6, 2012) ("NPRM") in the above captioned proceeding. In three simultaneous filed applications¹, Henderson is proposing first local service to Oakwood, Texas on Channel 233A; a change in community of license of KTWL (FM) from Hempstead, Texas to Todd Mission, Texas on Channel 287C3, which would be the first local service for that community; and, a change in community of license of KLTR from Brenham, Texas to Hempstead Texas as a back-fill. In order to accomplish these changes, Channel 267A must remain in Centerville, Texas and for the vacant channel at Lovelady, Texas, currently at Channel 288A, to be reallocated to Channel 232A. These proposed changes are mutually exclusive with this NPRM. In support hereof, Henderson states the following:

I. New Allocation to Oakwood, Texas

1. In lieu of allocating Channel 267A to Midland, Texas and replacing Centerville with Channel 232A, Henderson proposes to retain 267A at Centerville and to allocate Channel 233A to Oakwood, Texas. Oakwood has a 2010 U.S. Census population of 510 persons² and it has no local service. It is generally sufficient to demonstrate that the proposed community of license is incorporated or listed in the U.S. Census to confer community status, *See Oak Grove, Florida*, 5 FCC Rcd 3774 (1990).

2. Oakwood is a "city" in Texas established in 1872. It has a Mayor, a City Hall, Municipal Court, a police force, a volunteer fire department, multiple businesses (such as the Oakwood State Bank), a post office, two public schools (Oakwood Elementary and Oakwood High School), and nine churches³. The Commission has consistently held that under *priority 3*⁴ as set forth in the Revision of FM Assignment Policies and Procedures, 90 FCC 2d 88 (1982), that the provision of service to the larger community is preferred⁵. In this case, Oakwood has more than twice as many residents as Midway and must be preferred.

3. Henderson herein certifies that should the Oakwood allocation be approved he will participate in any scheduled FCC Auction.

II. New Service to Todd Mission, Texas

4. In its concurrently filed hybrid applications, Henderson is proposing a change of its Station KTWL from Hempstead, Texas to Todd Mission, Texas on Channel

287C3, thereby providing yet another first new service. To further accomplish this move, another hybrid application has been filed; Henderson proposes to move his Station KLTR from Brenham, Texas⁶ to Hempstead, Texas. KTWL is the only broadcast facility in Brenham so KLTR will be an immediate replacement.

5. In addition to the hybrid application above and, in order to allot Channel 287 to Todd Mission, Texas, for use by Station KTWL, the vacant Channel 288A at Lovelady, Texas must be reallocated on Channel 232.

6. Just as the Oakwood allocation, Todd Mission is another Texas town which has no local service. Todd Mission has a 2010 U.S. Census population of 107 persons⁷. Todd Mission is a “city” established in Texas in 1900. Like Oakwood, Todd Mission meets the criteria set forth in Oak Grove, Florida, supra. It has a town government (including a Mayor, City Attorney, City Secretary and Council, and Chief of Police), a volunteer fire department, and several businesses⁸. Todd Mission is also the home of the Texas Renaissance Festival.

III. Henderson’s Counterproposal Is Preferential

7. The proposal by Henderson meets all criteria set forth in Revision of FM Assignment Policies and Procedures, supra and all associated technical requirements⁹. Here, Henderson is proposing *two new local services* to communities deserving such service and as a result it provides a fair, efficient and equitable distribution of radio service.

IV. Conclusion

Demographics

As of the census^[1] of 2000, there were 471 people, 199 households, and 131 families residing in the town. The population density was 429.9 people per square mile (165.3/km²). There were 256 housing units at an average density of 233.7 per square mile (89.9/km²). The racial makeup of the town was 62.42% White, 35.03% African American, 0.21% Native American, 0.21% Asian, 1.70% from other races, and 0.42% from two or more races. Hispanic or Latino of any race were 3.18% of the population.

There were 199 households out of which 23.6% had children under the age of 18 living with them, 44.2% were married couples living together, 17.1% had a female householder with no husband present, and 33.7% were non-families. 30.2% of all households were made up of individuals and 16.1% had someone living alone who was 65 years of age or older. The average household size was 2.37 and the average family size was 2.94.

In the town the population was spread out with 24.0% under the age of 18, 7.9% from 18 to 24, 19.7% from 25 to 44, 27.6% from 45 to 64, and 20.8% who were 65 years of age or older. The median age was 44 years. For every 100 females there were 88.4 males. For every 100 females age 18 and over, there were 82.7 males.

The median income for a household in the town was \$25,625, and the median income for a family was \$33,750. Males had a median income of \$34,375 versus \$20,938 for females. The per capita income for the town was \$16,371. About 13.9% of families and 19.6% of the population were below the poverty line, including 14.3% of those under age 18 and 26.6% of those age 65 or over.

Education

The Town of Oakwood is served by the Oakwood Independent School District.



OAKWOOD, TX

OAKWOOD, TEXAS. Oakwood is on State Highway 79 three miles west of the Trinity River in the northeastern corner of Leon County. It was established as a ten-mile station on the International-Great Northern Railroad in 1872. It was initially called Oakwoods for the large number of oak trees in the area, but over the years its name was shortened. The town was first located on a low site a mile west of the Trinity River but was eventually moved two miles farther west because during rainy periods the original site became so muddy that the streets were almost impassable. A post office was opened at the community in 1872, and by 1880 there were seventeen families listed in the census. A. J. Walston, one of the early settlers, built a horse-driven cotton gin and a blacksmith shop. In 1896 a wood-frame school was built there, and the community's first bank opened in 1900. By 1904 Oakwood had a population of 542. Cotton was its most important cash crop for many years. The earliest crops were shipped on flatboats that floated down the Trinity River to Houston and Galveston. The railroad made Oakwood the leading cotton center in the area, and during the height of the cotton boom the town had three cotton gins. In 1925 its population reached a peak of 1,100. Oakwood suffered from the boll weevil and the Great Depression and began to decline in the early 1930s. Its population diminished to 888 in 1931 and continued to decline after World War II, dropping to 400 by 1970. In 1989 Oakwood had a population of 576, eight businesses, a class-A high school, and nine churches. In 1990 the community's population was reported as 527. By 2000 the population dropped to 471.



Todd Mission is located at 30°15′40″N 95°49′41″W﻿ / ﻿30.260997, -95.828048﻿ / 30.260997; -95.828048^[3]. According to the United States Census Bureau, the city has a total area of 2.1 square miles (5.4 km²), of which, 2.1 square miles (5.4 km²) of it is land and 0.47% is water.

Demographics

As of the census^[1] of 2000, there were 146 people, 56 households, and 33 families residing in the city. The population density was 69.7 people per square mile (26.8/km²). There were 75 housing units at an average density of 35.8/sq mi (13.8/km²). The racial makeup of the city was 80.82% White, 3.42% African American, 15.75% from other races. Hispanic or Latino of any race were 18.49% of the population.



65 years of age or older. The average household size was 2.61 and the average family size was 3.21.

In the city the population was spread out with 23.3% under the age of 18, 8.9% from 18 to 24, 38.4% from 25 to 44, 23.3% from 45 to 64, and 6.2% who were 65 years of age or older. The median age was 34 years. For every 100 females there were 124.6 males. For every 100 females age 18 and over, there were 128.6 males.

The median income for a household in the city was \$40,313, and the median income for a family was \$40,750. Males had a median income of \$24,583 versus \$21,458 for females. The per capita income for the city was \$16,309. There were 6.5% of families and 10.4% of the population living below the poverty line, including 18.2% of under eighteens and 33.3% of those over 64.

The City of Todd Mission is served by the Navasota Independent School District.







TODD MISSION, TX

TODD MISSION, TEXAS. Todd Mission, on Farm Road 1774 and the Missouri Pacific Railroad seven miles south of Plantersville in extreme southeastern Grimes County, was established as a station on the International-Great Northern Railroad in 1900 and named for an official of the road. Mr. Todd constructed a lumber mill in the vicinity of Mill Creek and a spur on which to haul logs from the yard at the rail line to the mill. The first homes in the community were those he built for the families of workers at his mill. E. L. Dyer also established a lumber mill in the area and donated the materials used to build the community's first one-room schoolhouse. By 1910 the town had three lumber mills, a general store, and an estimated population of 100. A post office named Todd operated there from 1901 to 1915. In 1919 a new two-room schoolhouse was erected, and a congregation of the church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints began to hold services in the building. The school became the Todd mission building, a Latter Day Saints project. The last meeting was held in November 1957. The building has been preserved as a historic site. When the Mormons moved to Navasota, one room of the schoolhouse continued to serve as a church and community center. In 1938 the local school was consolidated with the Plantersville school system. Todd Mission, as it was known after the Mormons moved in, dwindled rapidly after World War I. In 1989 the estimated population was sixty-four; the mail for local farm families was delivered from Navasota. In 1990 the population was fifty-four.
