Thank you for the chance to address this LTE forum on the FCC ECFS site.

Regarding public safety LTE deployments, we support the City of Charlotte and the State of Texas moving forward protecting their citizens and helping define the way forward for others. We support other early adopters.

Regarding the concern of "stranded equipment", we believe there is little chance of 3GPP standards based equipment actually being stranded, based upon indemnification from vendors and operators. The stranded argument is a red herring supported by those who do not understand the technology, have interest in slowing down deployments, and to a lesser degree PSCR's inability to match major test houses capabilities. Let PSCR manage a high-end test house that understands how to simplify this complex testing. You would not allow your car mechanic to do brain surgery. Do not make the same mistake with PSCR.

Regarding comments from Mr. Steven Marschilok, President of a Harris Corporation business unit on June 18, 2012. It is interesting to compare his comments there with the "HARRIS CORPORATION CODE OF CONDUCT", which he was required to sign. Quoting the "Public Communication" section, his filing must "contain no false or misleading statements or entries". The State of Texas and others have effectively refuted Mr. Marschilok's claims. The question becomes does the Federal Government condone the intentional falsification of public statements by Harris Corporation on Federal websites and to Federal personnel?

Regarding the FCC and others who make decisions based upon public comments herein, they are reminded it is election season. Please ignore comments from those whose only contributions are throwing mud. We will have enough of that from the 'professionals' in the next five months.
