**ENFORCEMENT BUREAU'S FIRST SET OF INTERROGATORIES
TO PUGET SOUND ENERGY, INC.**

1. Pursuant to Section 1.323 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.323, the Enforcement Bureau ("Bureau") hereby submits the following interrogatories to Puget Sound Energy, Inc. ("Puget Sound").

2. Puget Sound shall deliver its responses to the offices of the Investigations and Hearings Division, Enforcement Bureau, Suite 4-C330, 445 12th Street, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20554 within 14 days of the date of service of these interrogatories.

3. The obligation of Puget Sound to answer these interrogatories is continuing in nature. Puget Sound has an obligation to provide in the future any and all additional responsive information that may come to its attention subsequent to its answering these interrogatories but not initially disclosed at the time, date and place set forth herein or in any supplemental answers that it submits. In this regard, Puget Sound must supplement its initial and any and all supplemental responses if it learns that, in some material respect, the responses initially provided, or as supplemented, were incomplete or incorrect or if additional responsive information is acquired by or has become known after its initial or any supplemental responses.

Definitions

a. As used herein, the term “you” or “your” or “Puget Sound” means Puget Sound Energy, Inc., including all other persons acting or purporting to act on its behalf, including all directors, officers, employees, managers, shareholders, general partners, limited partners, parents, subsidiaries, whether wholly or partially owned, affiliates, divisions, predecessors and successors-in-interest or other affiliated company or business, or agents, including consultants, attorneys, and any other persons working for or on behalf of any of the foregoing during the period January 1, 2002 through the present.

b. “Act” shall mean the Communications Act of 1934, as amended.

c. “Commission” or “FCC” shall mean the Federal Communications Commission.

d. “Rules” means the Commission’s regulations found in Title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

e. “Site-based Authorization” or “License” shall mean each authorization identified in Attachment A to *Maritime Communications/Land Mobile, LLC*, Order to Show Cause, Hearing Designation Order, and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing, EB Docket No. 11-71, FCC-11-64, rel. April 19, 2011 (“HDO”) except authorizations WQGF315, WQGF316, WQGF317, and WQGF318.

f. The terms/phrases “referring to,” “relating to” and/or “concerning,” as used herein, shall be interpreted broadly and shall include, but not be limited to, the following meanings: constituting, comprising, evidencing, reflecting, respecting, discussing, referring to, stating, describing, recording, noting, considering, embodying, evaluating, analyzing, mentioning, containing, concerning, regarding, indicating, pertaining to, showing, bearing upon, studying, memorializing, or commenting upon, or any other term synonymous with or similar to the foregoing.

g. “State” and “describe” mean to set forth a complete and detailed statement of all information, circumstances and facts that refer to, relate to, reflect, comprise or bear upon the matter concerning which information is requested.

h. The terms “identify” and “identification” when used in reference to an individual person mean to state his full name, residence and business telephone numbers, and present residence and business addresses if known, and his present or last known title, position and business affiliation.

i. The terms “identify” and “identification” when used in reference to a person other than a natural person mean to state the full and official name of the business entity, its principal place of business, and the main telephone number of such business entity.

j. The terms “identify” and “identification” when used in reference to a document mean to state its date, type (e.g., memo, telecopy, email), and its authors, addressees, title, if any, and, if no title, a brief description of the subject matter of the document and its present or last known location and custodian. If any document once was, but is no longer, in your possession, custody, or control, state what disposition was made of it and the reason for such disposition.

k. The terms “identify” and “identification” when used in reference to any act, activity, practice, policy, effort, event, transaction, negotiation, discussion, conversation, occasion, occurrence, meeting, representation, agreement or communication, mean to: (a) describe the nature and substance of the act, activity, practice, policy, effort, event, transaction, negotiation, discussion, conversation, occasion, occurrence, meeting, representation, agreement or communication; (b) state the date when and place where it occurred; and (c) identify each person who was a participant therein.

l. The term “and” also means “or” and the term “or” also means “and.”

m. The term “each” also means “every” and the term “every” also means “each.”

n. The term “all” also means “any” and the term “any” also means “all.”

o. The term “Document” means the complete original (or in lieu thereof, exact copies of the original) and any non-identical copy (whether different from the original because of notations on the copy or otherwise), regardless of origin or location, of any taped, recorded, transcribed, written, typed, printed, filmed, videotaped, punched,

computer-stored, or graphic matter of every type and description, however and by whomever prepared, produced, disseminated, or made, including but not limited to any book, pamphlet, periodical, contract, agreement, correspondence, letter, facsimile, e-mail, file, invoice, memorandum, note, telegram, report, record, handwritten note, working paper, routing slip, chart, graph, photograph, paper, index, map, tabulation, manual, guide, outline, script, abstract, history, calendar, diary, agenda, minutes, marketing plan, research paper, preliminary drafts, or versions of all of the above, and computer material (print-outs, cards, magnetic or electronic tapes, disks and such codes or instructions as will transform such computer materials into easily understandable form) in the possession, custody, or control of Maritime.

p. "Discussion" means any assembly, congregation, encounter, meeting or conversation between or among two or more individuals for any purpose, whether or not planned, arranged, or scheduled in advance. "Discussion" includes, without limitation, all oral communications, whether or not in person, by telephone (including voicemails and similar recordings), or otherwise, and electronic communications (including emails) between two or more individuals.

q. "Communication" means any discussion or any written or electronic correspondence or recorded voice message of any kind.

r. "Employee" means any director, trustee, officer, employee, partner, corporate parent, subsidiary, affiliate or servant of the designated entity, whether active or retired, full-time or part-time, current or former, and compensated or not.

s. “Representative” means any consultant, expert, attorney, contractor or other individual or entity engaged by the designated entity to perform some task or assignment for the entity.

t. “Entity” means any corporation, company, partnership, proprietorship, joint venture, or business, as well as any governmental unit.

u. “Person” means any natural person or legal entity, including but not limited to any corporation, partnership, proprietorship, firm, trust, association, government entity, organization, or group of persons.

v. “Maritime” or “Maritime Communications/Land Mobile, LLC” means Maritime Communications/Land Mobile, LLC, including all other persons acting or purporting to act on its behalf, including all directors, officers, employees, managers, shareholders, general partners, limited partners, parents, subsidiaries, whether wholly or partially owned, affiliates, divisions, predecessors and successors-in-interest or other affiliated company or business, or agents, including consultants, attorneys, and any other persons working for or on behalf of any of the foregoing during the period January 1, 2002 through the present. For purposes of this definition, “affiliate” shall include, but not be limited to, Donald R. DePriest.

Instructions

a. The singular of a term includes the plural number and vice versa, any use of gender includes both genders, and a verb tense includes all other verb tenses where the clear meaning is not distorted by addition of another tense or tenses. Defined terms have the meaning provided above, whether or not they are capitalized below.

b. Unless otherwise specified, supply all annual data requested on a calendar-year basis; if any basis other than a calendar-year basis is used, such as to accommodate a fiscal-year basis, state as part of the response the nature and type of the basis so used.

c. Where an identified document has been destroyed, or is alleged to have been destroyed, state the reasons for its destruction, the names of the persons having any knowledge of its destruction, and the names of the persons responsible for its destruction.

d. Where an identified document is not in your possession, custody or control, state the names of the persons who have possession, custody or control of such document. If such document was in your possession, custody or control in the past but is no longer in your possession, custody or control, state what disposition was made of it, the reasons for such disposition, identify any persons having any knowledge of such disposition, and identify the persons responsible for such disposition.

e. If any information called for by an interrogatory is withheld on the basis of a claim of privilege, the nature of the claim of privilege and the nature of the information in respect of which it is claimed shall be set forth. Where the claimed privileged subject matter forms only part of the entire document involved, indicate that such is the case and whether you will produce the document with the privileged portions blocked out or obliterated in a copy thereof.

f. If you object to any part of an interrogatory and refuse to answer that part, state your objection and answer the remaining portion of that interrogatory. If you object to the scope or time period of an interrogatory and refuse to answer for that scope or time period, state your objection and answer the interrogatory for the scope or time period you

believe is appropriate (including in your answer a specific statement as to why you believe the scope or time period is inappropriate).

g. If the answer to any question is “None,” or if a section is not applicable to your business, so indicate rather than leave the space blank.

h. Unless otherwise specified, supply all information requested for the period January 1, 2002 through the present.

INTERROGATORIES

1. Identify, by call sign and location, each Site-based Authorization that you lease or have leased from Maritime.

2. Describe the coverage area provided by any facility that was constructed at each location for each call sign you identified in response to Interrogatory No. 1, above.

3. State whether there is currently a facility constructed at each location for each call sign you identified in response to Interrogatory No. 1, above.

4. State whether a facility is currently operating (*i.e.*, on-the-air, transmitting a signal) at each location you identified in your response to Interrogatory No. 1, above. If not, explain why not.

5. For each location you identified in your response to Interrogatory No. 1, above, state the date on which construction of a facility at that location was completed.

6. For each location you identified in your response to Interrogatory No. 1, above, state the date on which a facility at that location was placed in operation.

7. State whether a facility was operating (*i.e.*, on-the-air, transmitting a signal) at each location you identified in your response to Interrogatory No. 1, above, at the time you leased it from Maritime. If not, explain why not.

8. State whether a facility was constructed at each location you identified in your response to Interrogatory No. 1, above, at the time you leased it from Maritime. If not, explain why not.

9. State whether operations at each facility constructed at each location you identified in your response to Interrogatory No. 1, above, have ever ceased. If so, explain why and describe how long any such facility at any such location was not or has not been operating.

10. With respect to each Site-based Authorization you identified in response to Interrogatory No. 1, above, identify each location at which a facility was not constructed in accordance with the requirements of the relevant License, including geographic coordinates, antenna heights, and other technical parameters included on the License.

11. With respect to any location you identified in response to Interrogatory No. 10, above, describe how the facility differs from the requirements of the relevant License, including geographic coordinates, antenna heights, and other technical parameters included on the License.

12. Describe each Communication between you (or any Representative of yours) and Maritime referring or relating to Maritime's Site-based Authorizations, including, but not limited to, the date any such Communication(s) occurred, the names and affiliation of each individual who participated in or received any such Communication(s), and the subject matter of such Communication.


13. Describe each meeting which both you (or any Representative of yours) and Maritime attended referring or relating to Maritime's Site-based Authorizations,
