

Since Comcast's XFINITY TV App for Microsoft's Xbox 360 video game console and also for TiVo devices requires a high speed Internet connection ("broadband") to be accessed it is therefore a broadband service NOT A CABLE SERVICE as they claim. I'll repeat that XFINITY TV is a BROADBAND SERVICE subject to the FCC's Open Internet order that is violating the agency's Network Neutrality rules. Also since the Commission placed conditions on the Comcast NBC merger prohibiting Comcast from playing favorites (prioritizing its own online services over others) and discriminating against others by treating other streaming television and movie services like Netflix differently they are also violating their merger conditions.

Comcast's data caps are artificial, unnecessary, unfair, unjust, unequal and discriminatory. If you decide to watch TV online would you pick a service that doesn't count against your data cap or go with one that does? Chances are that you'd pick the one that doesn't count against your cap, which is just the way Comcast wants it. They don't want fair competition. They want to thwart cord cutters who abandon more expensive digital cable TV and its bundled channels for a la carte cheaper or even free online TV by making their online streaming service, which requires a cable TV subscription, not count against their data cap. Comcast should either eliminate the cap entirely or apply it equally even to its own services.
