

**Re: Application of Puerto Rico Telephone Company, Inc. to Participate

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Puerto Rico Telephone Company, Inc. ("PRT" or "Company"), by counsel, herein supplements the above referenced application to participate in the Broadband Adoption Lifeline Pilot Program ("Program"). On August 28, 2012, the Company spoke by telephone with Wireline Competition Bureau Staff. During the call, the Commission requested clarification concerning certain details of PRT's application.

In response to the Commission's request, PRT submits the attached table, which shows additional details of PRT's funding request. PRT also clarifies that Option 2 is a wireless broadband service option that includes a limited landline voice service plan. Finally, PRT clarifies that the Company does not seek to recover non-recurring charges from the Program fund. Rather, PRT will seek to recover non-recurring charges from Program participants who initiate a new wireline or wireless service: (1) an installation fee of \$85.00 for DSL service (Option 1); (2) an activation fee of \$50.00 for new wireline customers only (Options 1 and 2); and (3) an activation fee of \$36.00 from new wireless customers (Options 2, 3 and 4). Additional non-recurring equipment charges are due at service initiation as specified in the original proposal.
