REPLY COMMENTS BY JIMMY SUTTON

I have read the filings and comments re the GroupMe petition, and I would like to comment on those filings.

I would like reiterate that I FULLY AGREE with the comments of Mr. Gerald Roylance and Mr. Robert Biggerstaff.

I repeatedly receive unsolicited junk text messages that are sent without permission to my cell phones, which numbers are also on the National Do Not Call List. These messages violate my privacy and transfer the cost of the included advertising to me. I use messaging on my phone for contact with my family, including emergencies, so I do not view it desirable or even possible to turn off messaging—none-the-less, my privacy is frequently interrupted as my mobile phone notifies me of yet another unwanted solicitation. GroupMe and its supporters are attempting to blow a hole in the protections of the TCPA that will allow them to send uncounted millions of unwanted and expensive (to the recipients) text messages.

I strongly oppose any action that would weaken the TCPA in any way—in fact, I strongly feel that privacy and cost-shifting protections in the TCPA should strengthened.
